



Proposition 39:

The California Clean Energy Jobs Act

Ensures schools and communities benefit from energy efficiency and clean energy projects. Over the next five years, nearly \$2.5 billion in new revenue from the passage of Proposition 39 will help create clean energy jobs, reduce greenhouse gas emissions and save schools money by lowering energy costs.

Who is eligible and how much is available? For the fiscal year 2014–15:

K-12 Schools:	\$279
Community Colleges:	\$31.6
Energy Conserv. Assist.	\$25.2
Bright School's Prog:	\$2.8
Workforce Investment:	\$3.0
Conservation Corps:	+ \$5.0
Total (in millions)	\$346.6

Requests for funding by K-12 school districts are submitted to the California Energy Commission. Community colleges may request funding through the California Community College, Chancellor's Office.

\$279 million to school districts, charter schools, county offices of education and state special schools.

\$25.2 million to the Energy Commission's Energy Conservation Assistance Act-Education (ECAA-Ed), a nointerest revolving loan program for local schools.

\$2.8 million to the Energy Commission Bright School's Program for energy audits and other technical assistance.

\$31.6 million to California community college districts.

\$3 million to the California Workforce Investment Board for a competitive grant program for employment training in clean energy fields.

\$5 million to the California Conservation Corps for energy conservation related activities.

How are the funds spent?

The Energy Commission recently approved more than \$160 million in Prop 39 projects for 728 schools to begin retrofitting their facilities.



Eligible projects include:

- ✓ Repairs to heating, ventilation and air-conditioning systems.
- ✓ New chillers, boilers and furnaces.
- ✓ New lighting and lighting control systems.
- ✓ Installation of energy-efficient windows, shades and programmable thermostats.
- ✓ On-site clean energy generation.
